Now that you've said **yes to Jesus**, here are some steps and resources to help you grow as you begin this beautiful journey with Him.

1. Start a Relationship with Jesus

Christianity is not just about believing the right things or ticking the moral boxes, It's about being in a relationship with Jesus.

Think of this as spending time with Someone who loves you completely. Talk to Him. Sit and listen. Read His Word, even if it starts with a few verses a day. The more time you spend with God, the more you'll come to know His voice, His peace, and His heart.

2. Turn Away from Sin (*Walk in Freedom*)

Following Jesus means learning to let go of habits, patterns, and choices that pull you away from God. This isn't about being perfect, it's about choosing a new direction with Jesus as your guide.

As you grow closer to Him, the Holy Spirit will gently guide, convict, and strengthen you to walk in freedom. When you stumble, don't hide from God—run to Him. Grace is part of the journey, and growth takes time and intentionality.

3. Read the Bible

The Bible is your sword, It is God's Word to you—alive, true, and powerful. It strengthens your faith, renews your mind, and helps you discern God's voice.

Here are a few tools to help you explore:

- **The Bible Project (YouTube + App):** Short, beautifully illustrated videos that explain Bible books, themes, and key ideas in a clear and engaging way.



- **YouVersion Bible App:** Free and easy to use, with multiple Bible translations, reading plans, and devotionals. A great place to start is the Gospel of John or a “New Believer” plan.

Don't feel overwhelmed. There is so much treasure to be discovered, and the Holy Spirit will be your personal guide as you read, study and meditate on the bible. He will help you understand, reveal truth, and make God's Word come alive in your heart.

4. Find a Bible-Believing Church

You were not meant to walk this faith journey alone. God designed the Church as a spiritual family, a place to grow, worship, be encouraged, and walk out your faith with others.

Finding the right church is less about criticizing or comparing, and more about discerning where your **spirit connects**. Pay attention to where you sense peace, truth, and the gentle leading of the Holy Spirit. Where do you feel encouraged to grow closer to Jesus? Where does your heart feel at home?

“Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God.” — 1 John 4:1 (NIV)

It's okay to visit different churches as you pray and seek God's guidance. Every church has a purpose, and while not every one will be your spiritual home, each can still be part of your journey.

5. Learn and Grow

As your faith matures, you may want to go deeper and explore questions about what you believe and why. This is where understanding the mysteries of the kingdom and apologetics comes in — learning how to walk out, explain and defend your faith with love and understanding.

Remember to let your knowledge grow from time spent with God, not just information.
